 to share and be charitable during a time of economic depression.



Cookies, at the turn of the century, were originally made to test oven temperature. According to culinary historians, cookies as we know them today were first made not to eat but to test the temperature of an oven. Cooks would take a small dollop of cake batter and bake it as a means of gauging whether the oven was ready or not.

## What was the size of the largest cookie, according to the Guiness Book of World Records?

The biggest recorded cookie was baked on May 17, 2003 in Flat Rock, NC by the Immaculate Baking Company. It clocked in at 102 feet wide and weighed over 40,000 pounds. For baking, it was covered with a heatretaining film of polyester and blasted from the sides by 20 propane heaters. Once it reached 300 degrees, baking took about 10 hours.

in one hour is 6,018 and was achieved by Frank Squeo and Baking Memories 4 Kids, in West Nyack, New York, on
December 7, 2019.

## Who holds the record for the tallest tower of stacked cookies?

According to the Guiness Book of World Records, the tallest tower of cookies measured 6 ft 1/8 inches and was constructed by the Girl Scouts of Nassau County on January 9, 2010 in Garden City, New York. Sixty Girl Scouts used 22,800 cookies to build the tower.

## American cookie jars, descendents of British biscuit

 jars, were born out of need. They first appeared in the 1930s as Depression housewives slowly abandoned buying bakery-made foods, baking at home instead to save money.


Chocolate chip cookies were invented in 1930 by Ruth Graves Wakefield at the Toll House Restaurant in Whitman, MA. Mrs. Wakefield sold her chocolate chip cookie recipe to Nestle, who began manufacturing chocolate chips in 1939, and printing her recipe on the package.
 Massachusetts adopted the chocolate chip cookie as its official state cookie in 1997.


Queen Elizabeth I invented gingerbread men. While she didn't actually bake the cookies herself, she
 requested that her royal bakers create gingerbread cookies shaped like visiting dignitaries in order to honor them.
