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




#12 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Peanut Butter Balls dipped in Chocolate)











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




#11 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Made with a Cookie Press)


















#10 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Nestlé Toll House is the most used Recipe)


















#9 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(A Polish Traditional Cookie made with folded dough, cream cheese and fruit/jelly)











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




#8 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Cinnamon sugar cookies - German origin. A New England favorite since the late 1800s.)


















#7 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Popular both with and without Raisins)


















#6 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:






#4 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:

(Traditionally in the shape of a stylized human, although other shapes, especially seasonal themes and characters, are common.)











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




#3 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:






#1 Most Popular Christmas Cookie:
