

Catnip Toy Fish Pattern- Knitted and Crocheted



Knitted – size 6 needle – make 2

Cast on 9 stitches

Row 1 and all uneven rows – Purl

Row 2: Knit 2 tog – knit 5, knit 2 tog (7 stitches)

Row 4: Knit 2 tog – knit 3, knit 2 tog (5 stitches)

Row 6: Knit 2 tog – knit 1, knit 2 tog (3 stitches)

Row 8: Inc in 1st stitch – knit 1, inc in last stitch (5 stitches)

Row 10: Inc in 1st stitch – knit 3, inc in last stitch (7 stitches)

Row 12: Inc in 1st stitch – knit 5, inc in last stitch (9 stitches)

Row 14: Inc in 1st stitch – knit 7, inc in last stitch (11 stitches)

Row 16: Inc in 1st stitch – knit 9, inc in last stitch (13 stitches)

Row 18: Knit 2 tog – knit 9, knit 2 tog (11 stitches)

Row 20: Knit 2 tog – knit 7, knit 2 tog (9 stitches)

Row 22: Knit 2 tog – knit 5 knit 2 tog (7 stitches)

Row 24: Knit 2 tog – knit 3 knit 2 tog (5 stitches)

Row 26: Knit 2 tog – knit 1, knit 2 tog (3 stitches)

Row 28: Knit remaining Stitches together

Starting at nose, sew pieces together leaving a space to put small piece of tulle or netting filled with catnip inside, then finish closing.

Crocheted: E hook make 2

Chain 10, single crochet (sc) in 2nd stitch from hook, sc in next 8, (9 stitches), chain 1 turn

Next 3 rows, decrease in 1st and last stitch, chain 1 turn (3 stitches left)

Now increase in 1st stitch and last stitch on each row until you have 13 stitches.

Decrease in 1st and last stitch on following rows until you have 3 stitches left, turn

Crochet 3 together. End, leaving yarn long enough to sew together. Fill with small piece of tulle or netting filled with catnip inside, then finish closing.
